EDITORIAL

All praise is due to Allah (SWT), and peace & blessing on his noble Messengers (AS), in particular, on the last of them all the blessed Prophet Muhammad (SAAW).

Israel is an illegitimate Zionist terrorist state, whose creation was supported by all major Western powers backing the Zionist agenda. By dispossessing Palestinian Muslims of their lands and committing mass killings, a rogue state named "Israel" was established on May 14, 1948. Since its inception, Israel has been relentlessly pursuing its expansionist agenda—namely, the creation of "Greater Israel."

In 1948, the Nakba (catastrophe) occurred, followed by the defeat of three neighboring Arab countries in 1967. Celebrating these victories, then Israeli Prime Minister David Ben-Gurion declared in Paris that Israel's true enemy was Pakistan. Using the events of 9/11 as a pretext—engineered through American complicity—Israel targeted and devastated countries like Afghanistan (a vital part of the future Khorasan), Iraq, Libya, and others, causing shahadah of millions of Muslims in the process.

In 2017, the "Jewish Nation-State Law" was passed in Israel, under which only Jews are recognized as first-class citizens. Palestinian Muslims, considered Gentiles (goyims), have now been relegated to second-class status—so long as the Zionists have not expelled them from the Holy Land altogether. Prior to this, through the Camp David and Oslo Accords, Israel managed to pacify several Muslim states. During Donald Trump's first term, the U.S. formally recognized Jerusalem as Israel's capital and moved its embassy there from Tel Aviv.

Trump's Jewish son-in-law Jared Kushner lured certain Arab and African Muslim nations into the deception of the "Abraham Accords," under which those countries recognized Israel and established diplomatic and commercial ties. Trump also proposed the "Deal of the Century," aiming to annex 75% of the West Bank to Israel.

Over the course of a year and a half, Israel has carried out continuous brutal bombardments on Gaza, causing shahadah of thousands of Muslims and injuring hundreds of thousands more—leaving Gaza in ruins. Following this, Israel has shifted its focus toward other neighboring Arab states. These acts are all part of its grand plan to establish Greater Israel.

After the U.S., Israel's most significant ally is Modi's India. This is the same India where the Modi regime, following the Israeli model, is bent on committing genocide against Muslims in occupied Kashmir and within India itself. Just as Israel is illegally settling Jewish settlers from around the world on Palestinian land—flouting international law—India is settling extremist, even terrorist, Hindus and Pandits in Muslim-majority Kashmir.

Where Israel harbors the unholy intention of destroying Al-Aqsa Mosque, Modi's India has already demolished the historic Babri Masjid and constructed the Ram Temple in its place. On one side lies the sinister plan of Greater Israel, and on the other, the dream of Akhand Bharat under the banner of Hindutva.

India also directly supported Israel in its genocide against Muslims in Gaza, both with weapons and military assistance. This alliance of Zionism and Hindutva represents the very embodiment of the Qur'anic verse:

You will surely find the most intense of the people in animosity toward the believers [to be] the Jews and those who associate others with Allah..." (Surah Al-Ma'idah: 82)

In this global "Great Game," Pakistan is the common enemy and target of both Israel and India. The reality is that India staged a false flag in Pahalgam, like many other previously, and declared open hostilities against Pakistan.

One of the objectives behind staging the Pahalgam incident was to launch a false propaganda campaign against Pakistan, which could then be used as a pretext for aggression. The truth, however, has come to light globally.

Even close allies of India, including the European Union, supported Pakistan’s stance for a transparent and impartial investigation into the Pahalgam incident.

Nevertheless, ignoring even the counsel of its own allies, the extremist and Israel-aligned Modi government escalated the global Great Game by launching missile strikes on various regions of Pakistan during the night of May 6–7, effectively declaring war. According to Pakistan’s military and other sources, out of 20 to 24 missiles fired by India, only six partially hit their targets, while the rest were intercepted and destroyed mid-air by Pakistan’s air defense system.

Additionally, reports confirm that the Pakistan Air Force and its defense network successfully shot down five Indian aircraft and one drone, as well as destroyed an Indian brigade headquarters. According to the ISPR, the Indian missile attacks—tantamount to acts of terrorism—resulted in the shahadah of 26 Pakistani civilians and injuries to 46 others. Inna Lillahi wa Inna Ilayhi Raji'un. Several mosques were also targeted.

Furthermore, partial damage to the Neelum–Jhelum project and the Noseri Dam constituted a clear violation of international law, demonstrating India’s intent to deprive ordinary Pakistani citizens of water resources. On the night of May 7–8 and throughout the day of May 8, Indian drones brazenly violated Pakistani airspace, spreading fear and panic. Rumors circulating on social media only intensified public anxiety.

Pakistan, however, skillfully neutralized dozens of Indian suicide drones that were specifically designed to target radar systems, defense infrastructure, and fighter jets. In a telling sign of foreign involvement, the wreckage of these drones bore inscriptions in Hebrew—clearly proving the peak of the Indo-Zionist alliance.

After initiating a water-war against Pakistan and then attacking Pakistan continuously for 3 nights and days, especially the missile attack on Pakistani air bases on 9 May, Pakistan was left with no choice to give a strong and befitting retaliatory response – Operation “Banyanun Marsoos” – which was essential for its national defense and security. Pakistan moved beyond defensive measures, and launched offensive operations against India. India was paralyzed by Pakistan’s cyber and conventional attack. Many of its important strategic military assets were decimated. Rafaele jets are only as good as the combat pilots in their cockpits! Pakistan successfully destroyed India’s Russian-made Sukhoi aircraft bases and BrahMos missile sites. After jamming the Indian command and control thoroughly, Pakistan had India at its mercy, with the grace of Allah (SWT). By the grace of Allah, dozens of India’s critical military installations were damaged so severely that the enemy, utterly distressed, began pleading with the United States and other countries, asking that if Pakistan would not prolong the war, they too would be willing to agree to a ceasefire. Eventually, through the mediation of the United States and a few other nations, a ceasefire agreement was reached.

The Prophet Muhammad (peace be upon him) is reported to have said: “Do not wish to confront the enemy in battle, but if you do face them, stand firm. Know that Paradise lies beneath the shade of swords.” (Sahih Bukhari). That is exactly what Pakistan did. Alhamdulillah!

All in all, using the J-10c and JF-17 Thunder fighter jets equipped with superior PL-15 missiles, Pakistan showed that it is the King of the Skies (Guardian’s Lead). It would not be an overstatement that Pakistan has China to thank for its ariel superiority over India. Alamdullilah! However, the real tragedy is that out of 57 Muslim countries, not a single one provided any hands-on assistance to Pakistan.

However, in our view, the threat has not yet been averted. The enemy is extremely cunning, and India will attempt every possible means to violate this agreement, with full support from Israel.

In this backdrop, it must be emphasized that India’s actions following the Pahalgam incident—including various military maneuvers—were integral to the global Great Game, under whose shadow Israel advances its plan for Greater Israel. At this moment, Modi’s very lifeblood appears to be in the grip of Zionist forces. The Zionist-Indo (Jewish and Polytheist) alliance is evident (sic. Surah Anfal: 82), and their sinister goal is to weaken Pakistan and keep it entangled in a regional conflict, so that it would not be able to take any action against the nefarious designs of Israel in the Middle East.

Ceasefire or not, in light of the guidance provided in Surah Al-Anfal, verse 60, Muslims are instructed to maintain full preparedness for war under all circumstances: “And prepare against them whatever you are able of power and of steeds of war by which you may terrify the enemy of Allah and your enemy...” (Surah Al-Anfal :60). Thus, Pakistan must ensure that its defense capabilities are always at the highest state of readiness. The U.S. President Trump has even hinted at mediating on the Kashmir issue—which in reality is merely a pretext for maintaining an American presence in the region, allowing oversight of Pakistan, Afghanistan, and China alike. Therefore, the people of Pakistan, the government, the opposition, and the military establishment must remain constantly vigilant.

The government and the establishment of Pakistan must also keep in mind that the primary objective of both Israel and India is to sabotage Pakistan’s nuclear program and missile technology. The Pakistani people, religious and political parties, and the country’s leadership must remain united and place their trust in Allah, not in the fear of America.

India has been given a decisive response—but the Palestine issue and the Al-Aqsa Mosque must not be forgotten. We must demonstrate religious resolve in defending Palestinian Muslims and protecting Al-Aqsa Mosque. Alongside India, Israel must also be given a forceful reply so that we may avoid disgrace in both this world and the Hereafter.

India vs. Pakistan Ceasefire: Contextualizing India’s Failures

Those who have been following the recent India-Pakistan conflict will be aware that it is now widely known that the two nations have reached a U.S.-brokered “agreement.” Prominent Indian analysts, including geostrategist Brahma Chellaney, have characterized this outcome as a failure for India, arguing that its perceived military superiority failed to achieve any sort of lasting political advantage. Adding to the sense of frustration is the belief that New Delhi was effectively “strong-armed” into compromise by Donald Trump, and there are even reports that India had actually begged the U.S. to intervene. But was India really in control of the so-called “escalation ladder” to begin with? We will now see why India has not had the “upper hand” that they claim.

Loss of Rafale/s

Pakistan claims that India lost five fighter jets in the course of the recent air-to-air engagements: three Rafales, one MiG-29, and one Su-30MKI. India officially denies any such losses, while neutral defense analysts suggest at least two aircraft were downed, including one Rafale. This matters immensely, especially in light of Prime Minister Modi’s 2019 statement following the Pulwama attack, where he argued that India’s inability to respond decisively at the time stemmed from its lack of Rafale fighters, a procurement that has long been mired in corruption controversies. Even the confirmed loss of a single Rafale represents a significant setback. As a 4.5-generation multirole fighter, the Rafale was meant to symbolize India’s technological edge in the region and cement its aerial dominance over Pakistan. This belief draws from some century-old strategic thinking, most notably by Italian air power theorist Giulio Douhet, who emphasized that air superiority—particularly through the ability to strike civilian infrastructure and terrorize the local population—would define modern military dominance. The implications of losing a Rafale are both material and symbolic. Economically, each unit cost India nearly \$300 million. Psychologically, it undermines India’s narrative of aerial superiority and casts a shadow over the French manufacturer Dassault Aviation, whose stock value reportedly dipped after the incident. Going forward, this could damage confidence within the global defense industry when it comes to exporting advanced systems to India. There may be growing concerns that operational setbacks or inadequate integration with Indian command structures could greatly tarnish the manufacturers’ reputations, especially in contrast to Pakistan’s effective use of the ostensibly “inferior” Chinese-made J-10C.

The Israelization of India’s Military Hardware & Doctrine

Faced with the underperformance of its frontline fighter jets, India turned to Israeli-made Harop drones to sustain offensive operations. Yet, before evaluating this pivot from a military standpoint, it’s important to consider the diplomatic miscalculations it represents, both domestically and internationally. By deploying Israeli UAVs in a high-visibility regional conflict against a Muslim-majority nation, India inadvertently reinforced longstanding narratives—particularly among segments of the global and domestic Muslim population—that feed into the “Yahud-Hunud” (Jewish-Hindu) alliance perception. This notion, which frames India and Israel as aligned in a broader anti-Islamic agenda, gained renewed traction in the public discourse and on social media, and it was even referenced in a recent Times of Israel analysis. As the India-Pakistan confrontation unfolds, Birvadker believes that Israel’s role — albeit indirect — will not go unnoticed. Israel does not have formal diplomatic ties with Pakistan, and as Birvadker noted, its “standing in the Muslim world is already among the lowest compared to any other country.” While not anticipating any direct impact, she warned that “we will likely see more radical groups attempting to exploit the situation, drawing comparisons to ‘genocide’ and ‘occupation’ in light of India’s actions and Israel’s indirect involvement.” Such narratives, she explained, have long been present in parts of Kashmir, where conspiracy theories link “Hinduism and Judaism as working together to eliminate Islam.” In popular Muslim jargon, it is called the “Yahud-o-Hanud ki sazish,” or Jewish-Hindu conspiracy. While strategic partnerships are a reality of modern warfare, the optics of this decision have arguably deepened mistrust and polarization, both within India’s own minority communities (Muslims number anywhere between 220 and 250 million) and across the broader Islamic world. India’s use of Israeli drones in its recent strikes introduced a serious diplomatic liability, particularly given the global outrage over Israel’s actions in Gaza. The optics (especially in the Islamic world and among neutral observers) strongly suggested that India was attempting to emulate not just Israel’s military tactics but also its punitive strategy of targeting densely populated urban areas. This perception was reinforced by vocal endorsements from prominent Hindu nationalist figures who openly praised Israel’s hard-line approach as a model for India. And in practice, India did just that: it launched drone strikes on tier-one Pakistani cities such as Lahore and Rawalpindi. Militarily, this approach was highly questionable. Drones like the Harop lack the payload capacity and deep-strike capabilities necessary to effectively neutralize hardened military assets in urban environments. Strategically, the strikes caused minimal disruption to Pakistan’s military infrastructure. More importantly, from a diplomatic and arguably moral standpoint, the decision sent a deeply troubling message. India, for the first time in its modern conflict history, showed a willingness to strike civilian-adjacent areas in major Pakistani cities. This shift not only alienated segments of the international community, including voices that were previously neutral or sympathetic; it also undercut Pakistan’s own internal peace advocates. It hardened Pakistani public opinion and undermined the credibility of left-leaning, peace-oriented voices in Pakistan who had long argued for de-escalation with India. Among the civilian sites targeted by a drone was the Rawalpindi Cricket Stadium, which was struck just before a scheduled Pakistan Super League (PSL) match. This move carries profound symbolic significance given cricket’s status as the most cherished sport across the subcontinent. An attack involving cricketers echoes far beyond just the battlefield, striking at the heart of national pride and cultural identity.

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India had likely hoped to replicate Türkiye’s highly successful use of Bayraktar TB2 drones, as seen in conflicts like Nagorno-Karabakh, where Turkish drones devastated enemy armor, convoys, and command posts. However, the Indian effort instead exposed the absence of a coherent drone doctrine. There was no visible integration with broader ISR (intelligence, surveillance, reconnaissance) operations, no suppression of enemy air defenses (SEAD), and limited success in neutralizing key military assets.

Worse, by aligning its tactics and hardware with Israel at a time of widespread condemnation of Israeli actions in Gaza, India invited moral comparisons—and not in its favor. This allowed Pakistan to draw diplomatic sympathy even from non-Muslim and non-aligned states, who viewed the strikes as being part of a broader, reckless escalation.

Indian officials point to the fact that their drones penetrated deep into Pakistani airspace, reaching core urban centers. But this assertion is hollow and meaningless when viewed through a military lens:

(1) Penetration is not equivalent to operational success. Modern air defense systems are still challenged by low-slow-small (LSS) aerial targets, especially at low altitudes, so mere entry isn’t proof of superiority or capability.

(2) The failure to prioritize and hit high-value targets suggests that many drones may have been jammed, spoofed, or diverted, likely due to electronic warfare (EW) measures. Pakistan claims to have downed or neutralized at least 25 Israeli-origin drones, possibly with the help of Turkish EW systems like Koral, in which Türkiye is a global leader.

Ultimately, drone penetration without impact, while also at the cost of diplomatic damage, cannot be described as a success. If anything, it underlined India’s lack of battlefield integration, its overreliance on symbolic technology, and the steep geopolitical cost of replicating Israeli-style warfare without Israel’s strategic depth or diplomatic insulation.

Pakistan’s Counter-Op: “Operation Bunyan Marsus”

India codenamed its military campaign “Operation Sindoor,” a term referring to the red or orange mark traditionally applied on a Hindu woman’s hair parting, used to symbolize marital status. Intriguingly, the absence of sindoor denotes widowhood, raising questions about why this name was chosen. Some speculate it may be a grim allusion to the Pahalgam attack, where women and children were reportedly spared, leaving many as widows. If that’s the intended symbolism, it reflects a tone of vengeance more than strategic clarity. Even now, India is still searching for the actual perpetrators of the Pahalgam assault. Its decision to strike mosques and religious seminaries in Pakistan hasn’t produced concrete results. Instead, it underscores the operation’s ineffectiveness in both intelligence and target acquisition. The most glaring failure, however, lies in India’s inability to dominate the escalation ladder. Far from deterring Pakistan, Operation Sindoor prompted a well-coordinated Pakistani counter-strike: “Operation Bunyan Marsus.” Just as “Sindoor” draws from Hindu cultural symbolism, “Bunyan Marsus,” taken from a Qur’anic verse, carries deep Islamic significance: Indeed, Allah loves those who fight in His cause in solid ranks, as though they were a [unified] structure, joined firmly together. (Surah As-Saff :4) The name of the operation expresses emphasis on unity and collective strength. The symbolism is evident. The operation is believed to have been named by Pakistan’s Chief of Army Staff, General Asim Munir, currently seen as the country’s de facto leader amid a weakened civilian government. Munir is said to be a hafiz of the Qur’an, from a religious family that boasts numerous huffaz. Some argue that he may be the most religiously devout army chief since Zia-ul-Haq in the 1980s (who precipitated the end of the Soviet Union through Afghanistan) and that his religious leanings appear to dictate the messaging of Pakistan’s military doctrine. Even Indian media has acknowledged that key airbases, Udampur, Pathankot, Bathinda, Bhuj, and Adampur, were struck. While India has downplayed the damage, saying that there were no “heavy casualties,” these attacks clearly demonstrated Pakistan’s ability to bypass India’s layered air defenses, including the indigenous Akash systems, Israeli SPYDERs, and domestic radar grids. Pakistan didn’t merely match India’s escalation. By deliberately avoiding civilian targets, it gained a moral and diplomatic edge in the eyes of the international community. This may well be the key reason a ceasefire, though not officially termed as such by the Indians themselves, was reached. India, despite its population advantage of over 1.1 billion and presumed military and economic superiority, found that escalation didn’t proceed on its own terms. According to CNN, the deal is said to have been quietly brokered by U.S. Senator J.D. Vance, whose wife has Indian-Hindu heritage. Vance encouraged Modi to have his country communicate with Pakistan directly and to consider options available for de-escalation, the officials said. At that point, the officials said, the US believed the two sides were not talking, and they needed to get them back to the bargaining table. Vance also outlined to Modi a potential off-ramp that the US understood the Pakistanis would be amenable to, the officials said, though they did not offer details. Following the call, State Department officials, including Rubio, began working the phones with their counterparts in India and Pakistan through the night, the sources said. Among India’s nationalist circles, particularly within the Hindutva-aligned constituency, there is a palpable sense of betrayal. This sentiment is echoed loudly by figures like Arnab Goswami, the loud and sensationalist editor-in-chief of Republic TV, which possesses an audience running into the millions and is widely regarded as the most prominent media outlet that is sympathetic to the Hindutva worldview. Only Allah (Glorified and Exalted is He) knows what the future holds, whether the ceasefire will hold or if India is merely biding its time to regroup and retaliate. But what is clear right now is that Pakistan, particularly the Pakistan Air Force (PAF) and its civilian resilience, has exceeded people’s expectations. The message being projected, perhaps not just to India but also to the wider Muslim ummah, seems to be that of the strategic value of robust defense capabilities coupled with a committed ideological vision that is grounded in Islamic principles. And Allah knows best.

Operation “Bunyanun Marsoos” (“بُنْيَانُ مَرْصُوسٌ”) has shaken the enemy and its allies to their core.

Lahore (PR): This was said by the Ameer of Tanzeem-e-Islami, **Shujauddin Shaikh**, in a statement. The Ameer said that on the morning of May 10, immediately after the Fajr prayer, the Armed Forces of Pakistan—by the grace and special help of Almighty Allah (SWT)—launched Operation “Bunyanun Marsoos” against India, precisely in line with the expectations of the nation. This operation was a decisive response to India’s ongoing aerial terrorism over the past three nights and days. The Ameer added that India’s imposition of this war on Pakistan was intended to weaken the country, particularly as it stands as the greatest obstacle to the realization of "Greater Israel." We must set aside internal disputes and disagreements and unite as one nation. Moreover, even amid the anxieties of this conflict, we must not forget the brutal oppression being inflicted on the Muslims of Gaza, nor Israel’s nefarious intentions concerning Masjid al-Aqsa. The Ameer said that indeed, the creation of Pakistan was a miracle, and it stands as a remedy for the malignant entity that is the illegitimate Zionist state of Israel, which was founded nine months after Pakistan’s independence. There are clear Prophetic traditions indicating that from the region of Khorasan—which includes Afghanistan, northern areas of Pakistan, and parts of Iran—armies will march in support of Imam Mahdi. Pakistan must remain fully prepared to deliver a robust response to any potential Indian aggression.

Lahore (PR): This was said by the Ameer of Tanzeem e Islami, **Shujauddin Shaikh**, in a statement. The Ameer remarked that India has created an atmosphere of extreme tension by orchestrating a staged incident in Pahalgam, and the actions it has since taken against Pakistan have endangered not only Pakistan's peace but that of the entire region. Therefore, he emphasized, Pakistan must take this situation seriously and ensure it is fully prepared in advance to thwart India's nefarious objectives. The Ameer further stated that following the Pahalgam episode, India has not only launched a propaganda campaign against Pakistan but has also taken measures such as unilaterally announcing the cancellation of the Indus Waters Treaty. In response, the Government of Pakistan has undertaken a swift diplomatic campaign. Notably, India failed to have a resolution passed in the United Nations Security Council in line with its ambitions. Additionally, Pakistan has closed its airspace to and from India. Pakistan has issued a stern warning that it reserves the right to unilaterally terminate as many as 40 bilateral agreements with India, including the Simla Accord. Reports suggest that Pakistan has completed the deployment of its military forces along the eastern border. A senior government official has even stated that, in the event of an attack, Pakistan reserves the right to use nuclear weapons against India. The Ameer remarked that while these developments are, to an extent, encouraging, Pakistan must intensify its diplomatic efforts to expose India's true face to the international community. He pointed out that India is backing subversive and terrorist activities by exploiting the borders of Balochistan and Khyber Pakhtunkhwa—details of which must be presented before the world. He also emphasized the need for Pakistan to reevaluate its policies, and at the very least, to recognize that the unholy alliance of the United States, Israel, and India is founded upon enmity toward Pakistan and the Muslim world. Despite the gravity of the current situation, he said, there is still time to mend relations with China and the Islamic Emirate of Afghanistan rather than worsening them in pursuit of US appeasement. Pakistan is currently plagued by severe political instability. History bears witness to the fact that national armies defense requires unity between the military and the civilian population. Pakistan was founded on the basis of Islam, and its survival and security lie in the implementation of an Islamic system. Therefore, it is imperative that Pakistan be transformed into a truly Islamic state to completely defeat the enemy’s conspiracies.
